### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Although they are not in the spotlight nearly enough, our volunteers are truly the backbone of our organization. We would not have achieved the milestones that we have met without their hard work and consistent commitment to our organization. We are forever in gratitude for the time that they consistently give and the undeniable difference they make in the lives of our clients. Our remarkable success over the past eight years with 3,756 households served and nearly 40,000 furniture items distributed, is directly attributable to these individuals who show up in the warehouse to sort items, online to host clients, and on the trucks to pick up and deliver furniture.

As a volunteer-driven organization, we have grown to over 500 volunteers who work together in a myriad of roles in our warehouse and remotely to ensure that individuals and families transitioning out of homelessness receive furniture and basic home essentials, such as bedding and kitchen cookware. Our volunteers range from 12 years old to retired. Volunteers are involved in every aspect of our organization including client hosting, furniture processing, inventory uploading, sorting, data management, marketing, event planning and more. Our volunteer goals for 2022 include our continuing commitment to creating opportunities by increasing flexibility, roles, and access. We also intend to foster a sense of community and collective

dedication to the mission of New Life by enhancing the volunteer experience. We are hopeful that the year ahead will bring about more opportunities for us to be together in person to realize this desired outcome! Since our founding, New Life volunteers have served...



### FROM DONATION TO HOME

#### **FURNITURE DONATION**

Inspected furniture and household goods are picked up or dropped off.



#### **INSPECTION & PROCESSING**

Furniture is cleaned and household goods are sorted into kits.



### **INVENTORY & UPLOADING**

Items are inventoried and uploaded to the online store in our software.



#### **CLIENT APPOINTMENT**

Clients choose their furnishings in the online store for free with the help of volunteers.



#### ORDER GATHERING

Volunteers pull together the items selected by clients.



#### **FURNISHINGS GO HOME**

Clients receive their beds, furniture, and household essentials to enjoy their new home.

### **VOLUNTEERING**

IN RETIREMENT

I have been extremely fortunate in my life. Despite unexpected bumps in the road we all encounter, I have always had close family, a comfortable home to live in, food on the table, and never wondered if the bills could be paid. Despite the general affluence of the Greater Boston area, sadly this is not the case for many individuals and families who are burdened daily with the stresses caused by the uncertainty of their living situation.

As I approached retirement at the beginning of 2020, I gave much thought to how I could spend my retirement time productively and meaningfully. My wife Mary-Ellen significantly shaped my

retirement thinking. As a public school teacher she always went the extra mile for the students she knew came from unsettled home situations, often providing some of their school supplies or clothing they couldn't easily afford. I knew it was important to help reduce the stresses people in less fortunate situations than mine are experiencing, even by a little bit.

My first contact with New Life occurred several years ago when a church in my town was seeking people to join a Saturday volunteer shift picking up donated furniture and other household items from homes in the area to be given to people who are attempting to restart their lives. As I thought about retirement, New Life came back to mind and I decided this is where I should devote a significant amount of my volunteering effort.

I believe in New Life's mission and volunteer two to three shifts a week. I gather items for client orders, move newly donated items into the warehouse, record these items in the inventory system or do whatever else needs to be done at the time.

I always come away from each shift feeling I've done something tangible and meaningful. I also appreciate the camaraderie of the other volunteers I work with. The positive atmosphere at New Life is just what is needed these days.

### **SERVE 800 CLIENTS**

Having developed our virtual model and with hundreds of households on our waiting list, we strive to serve at least 800 clients next year.



Our current Volunteer Coordinator, Amanda Wolfe, will be transitioning into the newly created role of Operations Manager. In her place, we will have a new staff member, Amanda Hartley, in the role of Volunteer and Development Coordinator. Rich Purnell will continue to serve as our Executive Director and Wendy Carlson as our Client Administrator.



New Life worked closely with developers in creating our custom software that now manages our volunteers, pickups, inventory, virtual store, and referrals. As furniture banks across the country purchase the software, we will continue to implement new functions tailored to the furniture bank operation - including a CRM for fundraising and the expansion of existing features.


