Established in 2013 as New Life Home Refurnishings, New Life began its journey in a modest donated space, measuring less than 1,000 sq. ft. A dedicated group of volunteers, though small in number, tirelessly assisted a handful of clients each week. Fast forward to the present day, and New Life has expanded its reach significantly. Operating out of a 16,000 sq. ft. facility with the support of over 900 volunteers, the organization now serves more than 700 families annually.

Despite the remarkable growth, New Life remains unwavering in its commitment to providing support for families transitioning out of homelessness with dignity and respect. As we reflect on our journey, we anticipate the opportunity to serve an even greater number of families in the upcoming decade.

New Life has undergone a remarkable transformation in the past decade, and reflecting on our journey, it's astounding to think about the challenges we overcame, such as maneuvering furniture up to a 2nd-floor loft via a narrow wooden staircase. Complaints about the elevator now seem minor, considering that a decade ago, we eagerly wished for one!



In the earlier days, clients would arrive with trucks, cars, and U-hauls, navigating our warehouse to select furniture. Some were fortunate enough to have a moving company. Today, the process has evolved significantly, with many clients opting for the convenience of selecting furniture online, streamlining their engagement with our program.

From our humble beginnings as a small group of local community volunteers, we've blossomed into a diverse team hailing from various communities and spanning all age groups. New Life has not only breathed "new life" into our clients but has also profoundly impacted our volunteers. It has become a platform where both the young and old discover the joy that comes from giving a piece of themselves to help others. In my retirement, it has personally brought me a sense of purpose, joy, and the opportunity to forge new friendships each week. As we contemplate the future, the growth and impact of New Life remain boundless, and I look forward to continuing my presence on the dock every Saturday for years to come.

Furniture & Household Goods

Every family accessing our online store is presented with a sense of empowerment through choice. They have the freedom to select furniture that aligns with their needs and personal style, emphasizing the dignity of making choices rather than receiving directives.

On average, each family acquires 25 pieces of furniture alongside essential household items such as pots, pans, bedding, and towels. The turnover is swift, with items spending an average of just 5 days with New Life before finding their way to a new home. This constant flow is made possible by the generous contributions of hundreds of pieces each week, donated on Saturday mornings by residents, facilitated by furniture partners, and dropped off by conscientious junk haulers—all united in the shared goal of diverting usable items from landfills.

Over 63,000 items were saved from the landfill—nearly enough to fill every seat in Fenway...twice!

Together we have saved roughly 964 tons from the landfill. That is more than the weight of the spaceship endeavor!
